Blessed with a quick eye and a quick tongue, Gaulton has been a consistent and colorful radio and television broadcaster of the Canadiens' home games Saturday night.

He was good enough to be a pitcher in his hometown of Sydney, N.S., to be invited to New York Giants' training camp in 1932, but in the next year his arm gave out on him.

That started a chain of events that led to the broadcasting booth high over the ice in the Montreal Forum.

"I guess you could call it a blessing in disguise," he says. "But he certainly does the Canadiens mid-week games on radio."
