### Radio Hits Nationalists

JOHANNESBURG (AP) — Radio listeners in South Africa's Transvaal and Natal provinces picked up a mysterious station Sunday night. It broadcast anti-government propaganda and tapped out the V-for-victory sign in Morse. The station, calling itself "Freedom radio," urged that the V signal be drummed out everywhere until South Africa's nationalist segregation movement "can no longer stand it."

### Driver Is Found Guilty Of Criminal Negligence

"Guilty as charged" was the verdict handed yesterday by Judge C. St. Clair Trainor, County Court in the case of Donald Edward MacPherson, charged with criminal negligence in the operation of a motor vehicle. At the opening the judge noted that the case is the first to be tried in the Province under the new amended Criminal Code which permits an accused person to elect speedy trial before a judge of the County Court when making first appearance before a Magistrate.
