

Three Island Teachers Honoured

Charlottetown - Three Prince Edward Island teachers were honoured in the 1989-90 Canada program of the Marshall McLuhan Distinguished Teacher Awards.

They are Len Sirois, a guidance councillor at Birchwood Junior High School in Charlottetown, and the team of Nancy Fitzgerald and Pauline Coady of Bluefield Senior High School.

The awards, designed to reward and encourage excellence in the classroom, were presented by Minister of Education Paul Connolly at a reception March 30th, where Len Sirois was also identified as the province's 1990 winner of a national McLuhan award.

The provincial awards included \$2500 in cash and a Marshall McLuhan Medal. The team of Fitzgerald and Coady will split the cash award and each will receive a medal. Len Sirois, the national winner, along with those from the other nine provinces and two territories, will receive an additional \$2500 at a Canada Pro-

gram ceremony in Toronto April 26th.

"On behalf of the Government of Prince Edward Island, I congratulate the winners for the achievements which have earned them recognition as examples of outstanding leadership and creativity within our school system," Minister of Education Paul Connolly said in announcing the winners for the Marshall McLuhan Centre on Global Communications.

"It is gratifying to see teacher excellence at the elementary and secondary school levels receive this kind of recognition."

The MacLuhan awards, a presentation of the McLuhan Centre, are administered with assistance from the provincial and territorial ministries of education. They are largely funded by corporate sponsors, with additional support from the federal government through a Canadian Studies Directorate grant from the Depart-

ment of Secretary of State. For the 1989-90 Canada program, Telecom Canada, which provides the country's national telecommunications network, is the premier sponsor. Other sponsors include Air Canada, Global Television, TransCanada pipelines, Xerox Canada, Southam, Volkswagen Canada, K-Mart Canada, Dofasco and IBM Canada.

The McLuhan Centre was founded by Mary McLuhan as a non-profit educational centre dedicated to honoring the memory and furthering the work of her father, the eminent Canadian scholar and futurist, Marshall McLuhan, who coined the phrase "the medium is the message."

Len Sirois was recognized for his leadership in the development of an innovative program entitled "Crime Buster". It is suitable for use in late elementary grades. The program includes a workbook designed to

raise consciousness regarding the financial and social impacts of crime. The workbook discusses the importance of laws, the social and personal consequences of vandalism and shop-lifting, the Young offenders Act and procedures in youth court, and the true experiences of incarceration. Sirois developed both an extensive student workbook and a useful teacher's guide.

Nancy Fitzgerald and Pauline Coady, both teachers of home economics and family life in Grades 10 and 12, developed and entire grade 10 family Life program, covering such major subject areas as personality development, self-esteem, relationships, communication, decision-making and human sexuality. It has received tremendous support from students and parents. Their program has become the prototype for the Family Life program in grade 10 being developed by the Department of Education.
