Be it further resolved that this review board be held at least once a semester or when deemed necessary by any of the members of the board and that the results of the review be brought to council for discussion.

Motion: Hynes/MacDougall that the Student Union pay John Bently \$200. for alterations to the newsroom, as in conditions set down by the graduating class of 1982 in order that they donate \$1000. to fund these alterations.
