### Resistance To Red Guards Told In China Dispatches

MOSCOW (AP) — Resistance to the militant young Red Guards of China was reported in eastern and southern sections of China by Communist press dispatches here.

In addition, Japanese press reports said a crowd of 100,000 battled the Red Guards at Kwelin, capital of Kwangsi province in the south, and the army had to restore order. They also said there were other similar clashes in south China.

The Soviet news agency Tass said leaflets on Peking walls told of clashes between 30,000 metal workers, students and others against the "revolutionary masses"—presumably the Red Guard—Aug. 31 and early this month at Kweiyang, a city in Hunan province.

The Red Guard authors of the leaflet demanded that the provincial party committee stop at once "political reprisals" against the "revolutionary masses" and to free those arrested.

Correspondents of both Tass and the Hungarian news agency MTI in Peking told of Red Guard violence in Shanghai.

### OBITUARY

**WALTER M. BEARS**  
Walter M. Bears, of Charlottetown, passed away at the P.E.I. Hospital September 1, 1966, after a lengthy illness.

Born in Charlottetown in 1899, he was educated at West Kent School. He joined the Prince Edward Island Signal Corps in 1917 and at the end of World War I became associated with the Charlottetown Selling Agency. Later he started a wholesale dry goods agency under his own name in 1947 and was joined by his son, Gordon, as a partner. Due to illness he was forced to retire in 1960.

For a number of years he was vice-president for Prince Edward Island of the Maritime Commercial Travellers Association. He was active in the Fish and Game Association of Prince Edward Island and was one of the first members instrumental in forming Alcoholics Anonymous on Prince Edward Island, and represented this worthy organization at both Prince Edward Island and Maritime gatherings.

Among his numerous friends were many retail merchants of Prince Edward Island and he was well known for his conscientious interest in his many customers during the past years.

Mr. Bears was a member of Trinity United Church. He leaves to mourn his wife, the former Hilda I. MacDonald, his son W. Gordon and one brother, William, of Boston.

He was laid to rest Saturday, September 3, 1966, at Floral Hills Memorial Gardens.
