

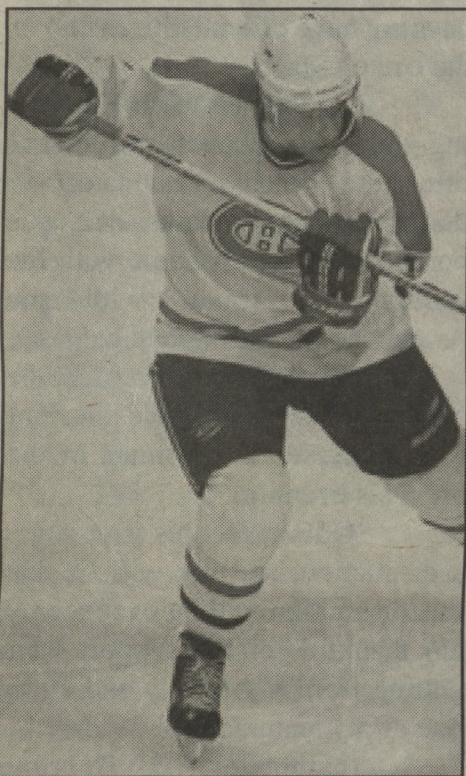
# Sp-Editorial

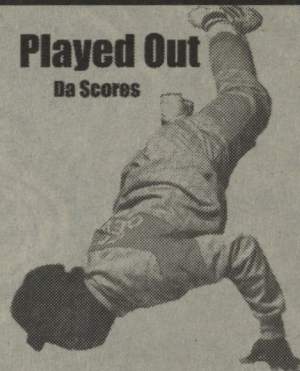
